## Student Uniform Policy, 2024

(There is to be no mixing and matching of old/new at the one time. Students must wear a complete uniform of one type (excludes school bags and hats)

|  | New College Uniform | Old College Uniform |
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| General Guidelines | The College has a standard uniform which should be worn at all times in accordance with the following guidelines: <br> - It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they are in correct school uniform at all times. <br> - All clothing should be clearly labelled. <br> - All clothing should be neat, clean and in good repair. <br> - All clothing should be of the style and colours described in the specifications for the College uniform. | The College has a standard uniform which should be worn at all times in accordance with the following guidelines: <br> - It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they are in correct school uniform at all times. <br> - All clothing should be clearly labelled. <br> - All clothing should be neat, clean and in good repair. <br> - All clothing should be of the style and colours described in the specifications for the College uniform. |
| Hairstyles | Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision and should not attract undue attention (for example: mullets). <br> - Hair should be in its natural colour and any highlighting that attracts undue attention is not permitted. <br> - Both males and females are to have their hair tied up if it is longer than collar length. <br> - Students whose hairstyle falls outside these guidelines may be sent home until the hairstyle is an acceptable style. | Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision and are to be of a type which will not attract undue attention. <br> - Hair should be in its natural colour and any highlighting that attracts undue attention is not permitted. <br> - Girls' hair, collar length or longer, is to be tied up neatly. Hair accessories are to be navy blue or the same as their hair colour. <br> - Boys' hair is to be no longer than the bottom edge of the collar and should be cut and well-groomed so as not to be untidy. |


|  |  | - Students whose hairstyle falls outside these guidelines may be sent home until the hairstyle has been restored to an acceptable style. |
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| Jewellery | - For both males and females, jewellery is not to be worn except for one watch, gold/silver sleepers up to 10 mm , or studs up to 10 mm (one earring per earlobe, spacers are not permitted). No other piercings are to be worn to school or to any school function. No rings, necklaces, or bracelets. | - Jewellery is not to be worn except for one watch, girls can wear sleepers or studs (one earring per earlobe). No other piercings are to be worn to school or to any school function. <br> - Piercings for boys are unacceptable either at school or at any school function. |
| Hats | - All students are to always wear a hat when outside, yearround. <br> - Junior School students can wear the slouch hat with their formal and sport uniform. <br> - From 2024, all Year 7 students will be required to purchase the slouch hat and sport cap. |  |
| Swimming Costumes | Students are no longer required to wear College swimmers. <br> - Girls can wear a one-piece, or two-piece with a rash shirt, board shorts. <br> - Boys can wear speedo's, jammers, rash shirt, board shorts. |  |
| School Shoes | - Shoes are to be black leather lace up school shoes with a raised heel of approximately 2 cm in height. No buckled shoes. Shoes that are suede or fashion shoes such as 'Vans or Nike' etc are not acceptable. | - Shoes are to be black leather lace up school shoes with a raised heel of approximately 2 cm in height. No buckled shoes. Shoes that are suede or fashion shoes such as 'Vans or Nike' etc are not acceptable. |
| Sports Shoes | - Sport shoes are to be specifically designed for running. They are to be worn with the sport uniform only. <br> - Street shoes, canvas shoes, skate shoes are not acceptable. | - Sport shoes are to be specifically designed for running. They are to be worn with the sport uniform only. <br> - Street shoes, canvas shoes, skate shoes are not acceptable. |
| School Bags | The College bag is to be used by all students. <br> - Current Prep and Year 6 students can use the same school bag in 2024. | - The Shellharbour Anglican College approved bag is to be used for each school day, including sports days and on excursions. |


|  | - Junior School students, including Prep, must purchase the College library bag for their library day. <br> - From 2024, all Year 7 students will purchase the Excursion bag. This is optional for Junior School students. |
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| Sport Uniform | - The Junior School sport uniform is to be worn on their weekly sport day and PE day. <br> - The Senior School sport is to be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and on days when a student has PDHPE practical lessons. <br> - Senior and Junior students can wear the softshell jacket on top of their sport jacket on sport day, for extra warmth. <br> - All students must wear the 'Shellharbour' sport socks with their sport uniform. Plain white socks are not permitted. <br> - Tracksuits are optional unless required for an event or excursion. |
| Girls Formal Uniform | For Junior and Senior School students, tunic and skirt hems are to sit at the middle of the knee, or lower. A skort hem can sit above the knee. <br> Junior School: <br> - There is no tie for Junior School students. <br> - Students have the option of wearing either a tunic, skort, shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt, year-round. <br> - The uniform includes shirts designed to be worn untucked with the skort, shorts and trousers. <br> - The school shirt is designed to worn with the top button undone. <br> - Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. |

- The only permanent addition to the backpack may be the name of the student and should be done tastefully.
- Stickers, texta markings and the like are not to be used to ornament the bag.
- The Junior School sport uniform may only be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and PE day.
- The Senior School sport uniform may only be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and on days when a student has PDHPE practical lessons.
- On sports days, the correct sports uniform is worn to school and throughout the day. In Winter, this means the tracksuit is to be worn to and from school, however students may change at school into the College sport shorts.
- For Junior and Senior School students, hems are to be no shorter than 5 cm below the knee for both Summer and Winter uniforms.
- Students must wear blazers or bomber jackets to any chapel/assembly.
- Plain white T shirts only may be worn under school or sports shirts.
- The top button on shirts and blouses must remain done up and ties should be correctly fastened at the neck.
- Shorts and trousers are to be worn around the waist and not on the hips.
- School Jumpers may be worn during the day without blazers or bomber jackets.
- Summer uniform to be worn during Term 1 and Term 4.
- Winter uniform to be worn during Term 2 and Term 3.

|  | - Students from K-6 will be required to wear a softshell jacket as the first layer of warmth, when required. <br> - Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the softshell jacket. <br> Senior School: <br> - Students have the option of wearing either a tunic, skort, shorts or pants. <br> - Students in Years 7-9 are to wear the charcoal tie, yearround. <br> - Students in Years 10-12 are to wear the ocean blue tie, year-round. <br> - Students can wear their shirt untucked or tucked in with the skort in Years 7-9 and skirt in Years 10-12. <br> - Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. <br> - Blazers are to be worn to and from school year-round. <br> - Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the blazer. <br> From 2025, Year 10 students will be required to purchase the new Senior uniform to wear in Years 10-12. |  |
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| Boys Formal Uniform | Junior School: <br> - There is no tie for Junior School students. <br> - Students have the option of wearing either shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt all year round. <br> - The new uniform includes shirts designed to be worn untucked with the shorts and trousers. <br> - The new school shirt is designed to worn with the top button undone. <br> - Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. | - Shirts are to be tucked in. The top button of shirts is to be done up and ties are to be worn appropriately. <br> - Students must wear blazers or bomber jackets to and from school during Terms 2 and 3. <br> - Students must remain in full uniform until they get home, even if they go elsewhere beforehand. <br> - On sports days, the correct sports uniform is worn to school and throughout the day. In Winter, this means the tracksuit is to be worn to and from school, however students may change at school into the College sport shorts. |


|  | - Students from K-6 will be required to wear a softshell jacket as the first layer of warmth, when required. <br> - Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the softshell jacket. <br> Senior School: <br> - Faces are to be always clean shaven. <br> - Students have the option of wearing either shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt yearround. <br> - Shirts are to be tucked in year-round. <br> - Students in Years 7-9 wear the charcoal tie, year-round. <br> - Students in Years 10-12 wear the ocean blue tie, yearround. <br> - Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. <br> - Blazers are to be worn to and from school year-round. <br> - Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the blazer. <br> From 2025, Year 10 students will be required to purchase the new Senior uniform to wear in Years 10-12. |  |
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| Mufti Days | The College will communicate information about Mufti Days as they occur throughout the year. |  |
| Dress at the College: | Senior School students must wear blazers to any chapel/assembly. |  |
| Year 12 Jersey's | From 2024, Year 12 students are permitted to wear their Year 12 Jersey as an outer garment to and from school. |  |
| Representing the College: | Students representing the College must wear full school uniform appropriate to their year group at all times. | Students representing the College must wear full school uniform appropriate to their year group at all times. |
