	 It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they are in correct school uniform at all times. All clothing should be clearly labelled. All clothing should be neat, clean and in good repair. All clothing should be of the style and colours described in the specifications for the College uniform. Hairstyles	 Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision and should not attract undue attention (for example: mullets). Hair should be in its natural colour and any highlighting that attracts undue attention is not permitted. Both males and females are to have their hair tied up if it is longer than collar length. Students whose hairstyle falls outside these guidelines may be sent home until the hairstyle is an acceptable style. 	As per new Uniform policy.

Jewellery	For both males and females, jewellery is not to be worn	
Jewenery	 For both males and remales, jewellery is not to be worn except for one watch, gold/silver sleepers up to 2.5mm, or studs up to 2.5mm (one earring per earlobe, on the bottom part of the earlobe, clear spacers are permitted). No other piercings are to be worn to school or to any school function. No rings, necklaces, or bracelets. 	As per new Uniform policy.
Hats	 All students are to always wear a hat when outside, year-round. Junior School students can wear the slouch hat with their formal and sport uniform. From 2024, all Year 7 students will be required to purchase the slouch hat and sport cap. 	As per new Uniform policy.
Swimming	Students are no longer required to wear College swimmers.	
Costumes	 Girls can wear a one-piece, or two-piece with a rash shirt, board shorts. Boys can wear speedo's, jammers, rash shirt, board shorts. 	As per new Uniform policy.
School Shoes	 Shoes are to be black leather lace up school shoes with a raised heel of approximately 2cm in height. No buckled shoes. Shoes that are suede or fashion shoes such as 'Vans or Nike' etc are not acceptable. 	As per new Uniform policy.
Sports Shoes	 Sport shoes are to be specifically designed for running. They are to be worn with the sport uniform only. Street shoes, canvas shoes, skate shoes are not acceptable. 	As per new Uniform policy.
School Bags	 The College bag is to be used by all students. Current Prep and Year 6 students can use the same school bag in 2024. 	The Shellharbour Anglican College approved bag is to be used for each school day, including sports days and on excursions.

Sport Uniform	 Junior School students, including Prep, must purchase the College library bag for their library day. From 2024, all Year 7 students will purchase the Excursion bag. This is optional for Junior School students. The Junior School sport uniform is to be worn on their weekly sport day and PE day. The Senior School sport is to be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and on days when a student has PDHPE practical lessons. Senior and Junior students can wear the softshell jacket on top of their sport jacket on sport day, for extra warmth. All students must wear the 'Shellharbour' sport socks with their sport uniform. Plain white socks are not permitted. Tracksuits are optional unless required for an event or excursion, but are to be worn as the first layer of warmth with the sport uniform. 	 The Junior School sport uniform may only be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and PE day. The Senior School sport uniform may only be worn to and from school on the weekly sport day and on days when a student has PDHPE practical lessons. Junior and Senior School students are not required to wear the tracksuit to and from school, unless otherwise notified.
Girls Formal Uniform	 For Junior and Senior School students, tunic and skirt hems are to sit at the middle of the knee, or lower. A skort hem can sit no higher than 4cm, when measuring from the top of the knee. Junior School: There is no tie for Junior School students. Students have the option of wearing either a tunic, skort, shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt, year-round. The uniform includes shirts designed to be worn untucked with the skort, shorts and trousers. The school shirt is designed to worn with the top button undone. Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. 	 For Junior and Senior School students, hems are to be no shorter than 5cm below the knee for both Summer and Winter uniforms. Students must wear blazers or bomber jackets to any chapel/assembly. Plain white T shirts only may be worn under school or sports shirts. The top button on shirts and blouses must remain done up and ties should be correctly fastened at the neck. Shorts and trousers are to be worn around the waist and not on the hips. School Jumpers may be worn during the day without blazers or bomber jackets. Students can wear the old summer or old winter uniform year-round.

	 Students from K-6 are to wear their softshell jacket to and from school, year-round. Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the softshell jacket. Senior School: Students have the option of wearing either a tunic, skort, shorts or pants. Students in Years 7-9 are to wear the charcoal tie, yearround. Students in Years 10-12 are to wear the ocean blue tie, year-round. Students can wear their shirt untucked or tucked in with the skort in Years 7-9 and skirt in Years 10-12. Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. Blazers are to be worn to and from school year-round. 	
	From 2025, Year 10 students will be required to purchase the new Senior uniform to wear in Years 10-12.	
Boys Formal Uniform	 Junior School: There is no tie for Junior School students. Students have the option of wearing either shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt all year round. The new uniform includes shirts designed to be worn untucked or tucked in with the shorts and trousers. The new school shirt is designed to worn with the top button undone. Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. 	 Junior and Senior students: Shirts are to be tucked in. The top button of shirts is to be done up and ties are to be worn appropriately. Students must wear blazers or bomber jackets yearround. On sports days, the correct sports uniform is worn to school and throughout the day.

	 Students from K-6 are to wear their softshell jacket to and from school, year-round. Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the softshell jacket. Senior School: Faces are to be always clean shaven. Students have the option of wearing either shorts or pants with either a short sleeve or long sleeve shirt year-round. Students can wear their shirt untucked or tucked in with the shorts/trousers in Years 7-9 and skirt in Years 10-12. Students in Years 7-9 wear the charcoal tie, year-round. Students must wear the new 'Shellharbour' socks with their formal uniform. Blazers are to be worn to and from school year-round. Jumpers are not to be worn as outer garments, only under the blazer. 	
Mufti Days	The College will communicate information about Mufti Days as they occur throughout the year.	
Dress at the College:	Senior School students must wear blazers to any chapel/assembly.	
Year 12 Jersey's	From 2024, Year 12 students are permitted to wear their Year 12 Jersey as an outer garment to and from school.
